Accessibility within the King's Cross Neighbourhood



This regenerated neighbourhood is wheelchair accessible, with a ramp down to the canal towpath behind The Lighterman restaurant and an accessible entrance to Coal Drops Yard from the towpath and Granary Square.

Lifts and ramps are also available at Coal Drops Yard and all public toilets are fully accessible.

Discovering accessible destinations across the UK

When you're planning any future trips, Accessible Britain is well worth checking out. It's a one stop shop for discovering accessible tourism options across the UK.

Accessibility within St. Pancras International Station

Pre-booked assistance is available throughout the station. If you need mobility or luggage assistance whilst at the station, station staff will be pleased to help. Please speak to any of the Customer Service Assistants on the concourse wearing light blue St. Pancras vests or ask any member of staff for advice. The station has accessible toilets and has lifts throughout the station, along with additional facilities in the Eurostar departure lounge.

We encourage you to contact train operators 48 hours in advance to book your journeys from the station and request any additional assistance needed.



Concessionary Fares

If you're registered as blind or visually impaired and are travelling with another person, you're entitled to concessionary fares and discounts of up to 50% across the entire LNER network. You're also entitled to concessionary fares for any one adult travelling with you if you're using your own wheelchair during a journey.

It's also worth checking to see if you qualify for the Disabled Person's Railcard through LNER and Southeastern that gives you and an adult companion a third off most Standard and First Class rail fares throughout the UK.
